Update from Mrs Blake

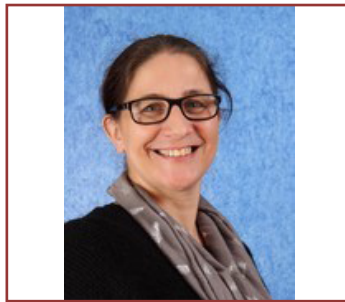
As we approach the end of this half term, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on our accomplishments. I am immensely proud of the dedication and hard work displayed by our entire school community.

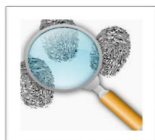
Explorers

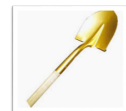
Pathfinders

Thought for the week

I sought the Lord, and he answered me, and delivered me from all my fears.
- Psalm 34:4.

I think this verse is another great challenge, primarily because it reminds me of the amount of times I fail to seek the Lord as I should! And I wonder how many of us can relate to that?

We will talk about God's promises to us, love for us and the new life that God brings to us and yet, sometimes, we try to rely on our own will or strength. With that often comes a lack of confidence leading to hesitation and anxiety and, all the time, God must be waiting, frustrated, at our failure to turn to him.

This verse is a reminder that in all things we can trust God and that in all situations we can turn to the Lord

and pray for strength and power, comfort and protection, wisdom and love. I think that the church today is often lacking in confidence and we are nervous about speaking out for justice and peace for fear of whom we might offend.

Well, we can be confident because God has done all that is needed for us to be so – confident in sharing the good news of Jesus, confident in standing up for what is right, for seeking to protect those who are less able to protect themselves and confident to tell people they are special and they are loved, just as each one of us in God's eyes, is special and loved.
