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### Nursery

In Nursery this week we've been learning all about Diwali. We've been exploring colour with colour mixing, making our own Mehndi patterns with paint and loose parts and creating our own Rangoli patterns with coloured rice.



### **Adventurers**

This week we have begun focussing on the book 'How to Catch a Star', we thought about what we would play if we had a star as a friend. We have also had so much fun in our space workshop!



### **Discoverers**

This week we have been using past tense and verbs when writing sentences based on the story of the 'Queen's Hat.' In Maths, we have been solving addition number problems using the 'whole-part' model. In Science we have been learning about our senses. We played a listening game.



### **Explorers**

We have begun learning the songs for our Christmas nativity. In English we have been writing our own sequels based on our key text. In Maths we have continued learning and refining our addition and subtraction strategies. In Science we have described the different stages of human life.

### **Investigators**

In Science this week we continued our lessons on forces, enjoying the chance to play with magnets to observe magnetic forces. **Our Computing lessons** progressed to manipulating objects that we have designed on our drawing program.



### **Pathfinders**

Year 4 have had another busy week with lots of times table practice! We've also been painting again, discussing the benefits of living near a volcano and even started talking about Christmas.



#### Groundbreakers

We have started our new unit on fractions and have been finding equivalent fractions. For history, we looked at Ancient Greece and how life was different between the states of Athens and Sparta. The children also really enjoyed their workshop on the Ancient Greeks.



#### **Trailblazers**

This week we have been exploring global warming. Within maths we have begun to look at multiplication with fractions. We also took part in a fun Drama workshop on Friday with Open Box.



### Thought for the week

A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien. - Deuteronomy 26:5 from full reading Deuteronomy 26:5-10.

How do we think of ourselves? I am surprised by the number of people who in their heart of hearts do not think their reputation matches their true selves. People sometimes admit, 'I am surprised no one has found me out yet'. It can be a heavy burden to carry.

Before God we can face the truth. Christians know that 'while we still were sinners, Christ died for us' (Romans 5:8). In today's passage, the Israelites knew something similar: 'A wandering Aramean was my ancestor' (Deuteronomy 26:5).

This confession was supposed to guide them through the whole time of the settlement in the promised land and their life there and elsewhere. Scholars tell us that this passage, like much of the Old

Testament, only took its current form after the people had been chastened again through the experience of exile.

God tells us not to think more highly of ourselves, because in the Lord's love we have the greatest exaltation possible and that is to be shared with others. Even when wandering or in exile our identity is secure. We are all children of God.

Loving God, help me to know more of your love for me and so bring me to a place where I am able to love others selflessly.
