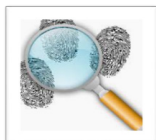
Explorers

We pray for peacemakers everywhere and

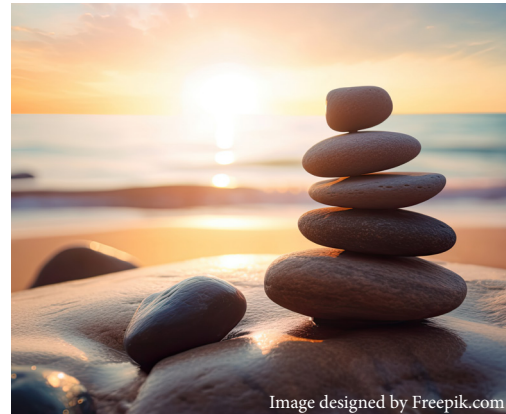
