Jesus didn't come as a mighty warrior with a mass army. He came as a baby, born into a poor rural community.

Jesus didn't build huge buildings and establish mass marketing plans. He left the vital good news message in the hands of a few terrified disciples, many of whom had dubious backgrounds.

The kingdom is like mustard seeds and yeast. God is often at work in what the world sees as unimportant and the insignificant. However, God's kingdom is expanding and growing all around us. It just depends what kind of lens we are looking through.

It is easy to feel small and insignificant. But then just remember this parable and remember that you have a role to play for the king and the kingdom.


