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Nursery

In Nursery this week we've been investigating environmental sounds in phonics and went around the school on a sound hunt! We visited the school library and chose books to take home to share with our grown ups. We also made our own poppies by finger printing.

We also enjoyed our first walk down to St. Martin's for the schools remembrance service and enjoyed making a poppy wreath.

This week we have been continuing our writing based on the story, 'The Queen's Hat.' We have been using alliteration! In Maths, we have been learning about fact families for numbers to 10. In Geography we are learning about the seasons. We also created a class poppy wreath.




Explorers


Pathfinders
