Nursery

In Nursery this week we've been continuing to read 'The Snail and the Whale'. We've been colour mixing and creating different shades of blue to paint the whale from the story.



Adventurers

This week in maths we have been learning to work with numbers to 20 and beyond. We have also been looking at the different houses and areas that we live in.



Discoverers

This week in Year 1, we have been thinking about fruit vegetable and which are harvested overground and underground. We have also been looking at different ways explorers travel, as part of our History Topic.



Explorers

This week Explorers have started to plan their sequels to our key text 'The Friendship Bench.' In History we have been learning all about our monarch and the different stages of a coronation ceremony.



Investigators

Investigators have been green-fingered with our Science enquiries so far this term. We have set up 3 geranium plants, and give each either 0ml, 10ml or 20ml of water every day, observing and recording their progress in Soft Start sessions.



Pathfinders

Year 4 have started their work on decimals and have been identifying their connection to fractions. They have also been composing and writing melodies as well as starting to think about how electricity flows to power components in a circuit.



Groundbreakers

In Year 5, we started out topic on Hinduism with our big question 'What does it mean to be a Hindu?'. In English, we have been looking at 'Plastic Pollution' in order to write a persuasive piece of writing to persuade others to avoid the use of single-use plastics.



Trailblazers

This week in maths we have been looking at angles. From acute to obtuse, right to straight and reflex, we have been using protractors to measure these.



Thought for the week

Why do you call me 'Lord, Lord', and do not do what I tell you? I will show you what someone is like who comes to me, hears my words, and acts on them. That one is like a man building a house, who dug deeply and laid the foundation on rock; when a flood arose, the river burst against that house but could not shake it, because it had been well built. But the one who hears and does not act is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation. When the river burst against it, immediately it fell, and great was the ruin of that house. - Luke 6:46-49.



Something to think about

You can feel the frustration out of which Jesus tells this familiar story. People aren't getting it. They are in love with the stories he is telling and the miracles he performs.

But they are letting him, and the world he is offering, stay at arms' length. His message is not going deep enough; transformed lives remain elusive even with Jesus in their midst.

It isn't enough to hear the word

from God. This word, voiced by Jesus, would lay hold of us if we let it. This word, carried to us through our Bibles, would transform our living if we truly let it. This word, brought to life amidst us by the Holy Spirit, would captivate and bless, judge and heal, challenge and restore us if we dare to let it become our foundation.

Jesus seeks us out and bids us to follow him. He calls us to be friends to him and for each other; disciples and children of God. But following

can be a shallow response when our daily living is not built upon real devotion to him.

Hearing without doing makes faithfulness into a sham. Jesus does not want pretence. He comes to invite us to stop pretending and to begin to live. We need deep foundations.
