Our School Rules

Respect others, yourself and the school.

Listen and follow instructions.

Keep your hands and feet to yourself.

All children in Nursery, Reception and Years 1 – 6 are expected to:

- Treat other people as they would like to be treated.
- Listen and follow instructions.
- Be polite and helpful.
- Keep hands and feet to themselves.
- Tell a member of staff if they are worried or unhappy.
- Come to school on time, with the things they need for the school day.
- Do my class work and homework as well as they can.
- Support and attend school events.
- Understand that parents/carers will have to pay £5 to replace a lost or damaged reading/library book.
- Wear their school uniform correctly and with pride, and be tidy in appearance.
- Always try their best!



Parents/Carers are expected to adhere to the following:

Attendance and Punctuality:

- Ensure your child arrives at 8.30am, attends regularly, and inform the school of any absences by 8:50 am each morning.
- Do not arrange holidays during term time.

Communication with the School:

- Inform the school of changes to emergency contact details, address, and any relevant family history or concerns.
- Attend parents' evenings and discussions about your child's progress.
- If necessary, follow the school's complaints procedure by contacting the school directly.

Support for the School and Child:

- Support the school's behaviour policy, trust the school to manage incidents fairly, support school events, and assist with homework.
- Support the school in teaching safe and secure internet use at home.

Adherence to Policies:

- Observe school policies and procedures regarding GDPR.
- Consider local residents by parking legally and thoughtfully.
- Pay £5 to replace lost or damaged reading/library books.

Acceptable and Encouraged Parental and Visitor Behaviour:

- Refrain from any behaviour which interferes or threatens to interfere with the operation of the school.
- Maintain a calm and respectful demeanour in all interactions within the school environment. Communicate any concerns or disagreements in a polite and constructive manner, using appropriate language.
- Ensure the physical and emotional safety of all members of the school community and the school environment. Refrain from any form of aggression, threats, or harm.
- Communicate respectfully and constructively through appropriate channels. Avoid use of social media or other platforms for complaints or defamation.
- Direct any concerns about interactions between children to school staff. Never approach someone else's child in order to discuss or chastise them because of their actions towards your own child/children.



The School's Responsibilities:

Values and Environment:

- Value each member of the school community in accordance with our Christian ethos and encourage children to do their best.
- Provide a safe, secure, nurturing environment where children are valued and happy.
- Ensure that staff have the appropriate training to handle children when necessary to maintain safety and wellbeing.
- Support children in overcoming personal barriers to learning.
- Recognise and celebrate every child's achievements.

Curriculum and Standards:

- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum.
- Expect high standards of behaviour and promote respect for all.
- Model expected behaviour.
- Set and monitor appropriate homework.

Communication with Parents:

- Inform parents of their child's progress regularly and of any concerns or problems affecting their learning or behaviour.
- Contact parents regarding issues with attendance, punctuality, or behaviour.
- Respond quickly to enquiries or concerns and keep parents informed about school developments and activities.
