It has been another wonderful week here at BWI.

I am also delighted to share the exciting news of our new Head Students for this year. We are already so proud of them and look forward to seeing the leadership they will bring to our school community.

Today, we listened to the lockdown alarm and I led an assembly to remind everyone what to do if we hear it. The children responded so sensibly and showed great maturity. While practising, they enjoyed a story or quiet activity as they sat calmly. We talked about how the lockdown alarm helps us know when we need to stay inside to keep safe, and how this is different from the fire alarm, which tells us we must leave the building straight away. Well done to all of our children!

Next week, we will be taking part in NSPCC PANTS Week across the school. This is an important part of our safeguarding and PSHE curriculum, helping children learn how to stay safe in a way that is age-appropriate and empowering. 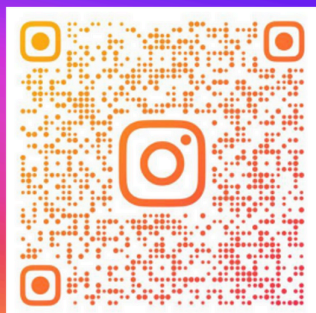
