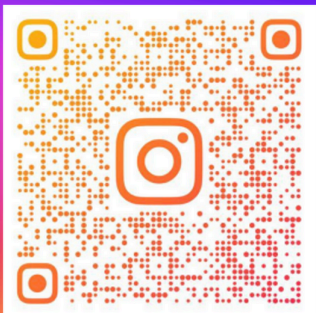

Nursery

Adventurers

In English this week, we have been writing about the life of athlete, Florence Joyner. In Maths we have been using the whole-part model for addition. In Phonics we have been learning 'ea' saying ee. For PSHCE we thought about different things we can do to relax at home and at school.

Explorers



In RE this week we learnt about temptation. We had a sweet on our table for the entire lesson and if the sweet didn't touch our mouths, at the end of the lesson we got to eat that one and another! (We all managed not to be tempted!). In math's we have been working hard on fact families and related facts to numbers within 100.

Investigators



We have begun our new writing focus based on the non-fiction book 'Skara Brae' by Dawn Finch, where we are writing a persuasive holiday brochure advertising this site. In Science they have been learning about how animals and humans use food for energy.

In English we have been looking at balanced arguments and whether humans should be allowed to feed animals in National Parks. We created different solutions and used vocabulary such as clear, colourless, coloured, no visible particles or visible particles, soluble, insoluble etc to identify if it was a solution or not. We had great fun and got a bit messy!
