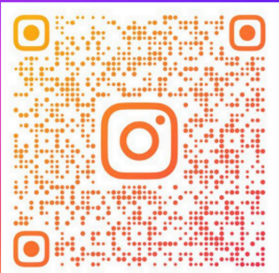

Nursery



We have been reading and exploring The Three Little Pigs, enjoying retelling the story and joining in with repeated phrases. The children are super excited as our role play area has transformed into a Winter Wonderland, inspiring imaginative play.

Adventurers



This week, we have been getting creative and making our own Christmas baubles! The children have also enjoyed crafting colourful paper chains to decorate our classroom, helping to bring some festive cheer to our learning environment. In Maths, we have been exploring rectangles, identifying their sides and corners, and using them in our own creative designs.

Discoverers



This week, we have been writing sentences describing windy weather, based on 'The Queen's Hat.' In phonics we have been learning 'ch' saying c. In Maths we have been completing subtraction number sentences using a number line. In Geography we have been drawing birds-eye maps of our classroom and playground.

Explorers



This week we had an amazing trip to RAF Hendon where we saw many different types of aircraft and took part in a workshop called 'Fantastic Flights!'. In math's we have begun our new topic on shape and have learnt how to count and draw shapes accurately. In English we are busy planning our writing to end our unit on 'My Christmas Star'.

Investigators have enjoyed creating their own disaster stories based on our recent picture book prompt, 'Flood'. Theirs told the story of a school being flooded! In maths we have been finishing off our addition and subtraction unit, and in RE we have begun our Christmas topic about what the prophets foretold.

In our English lessons this week in Pathfinders, we have been planning, writing, editing, and then publishing the next part of The Iron Man story. In our Science lesson, we carried out an experiment to test which materials are conductors and insulators of electricity.

We have developed our empathy skills a lot this week! We have also started working on fractions and identifying equivalent fractions, we are realizing the importance of our times tables facts. In Science, they have been investigating what affects the angle of a reflective ray of light, applying careful observation and inquiry skills.
