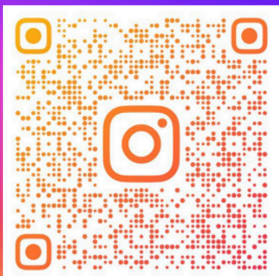

Nursery



This week in Nursery the children have been learning about fire fighters and fire safety, as part of our topic on people who help us. The children made fire fighters and painted a big red fire engine!

Adventurers



This week in Reception we have had lots of fun coming back in after Christmas and talking about all the many things we have done over the holidays. We have also been exploring winter and have created our own snowflakes using pipe cleaners and beads.

Discoverers



This week we have begun reading 'Pinocchio' as part of our new English unit. In Phonics, we have been learning ew saying 'yoo' and 'oo.' In Maths we have been learning the value of numbers from 10 to 20. In RE we have been learning about Judaism and special objects used in worship.

Explorers



This week in English we begun our new story called 'Milo Imagines the World'. In math's we focused on recognising and making equal groups. In D&T we had fun creating links using split pins for our moving monster and in science we investigated what different objects are made of.

Investigators



Investigators have enjoyed beginning their writing based on Julia Donaldson's 'The Magic Paintbrush', and have also been listening and responding to Chinese music in Music lessons. Our new 'Rocks and soils' topic in Science has been teaching us about the difference between igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic rocks.

Pathfinders



In our English lessons, we have been reading Charlie and the Chocolate Factory and using the text as a stimulus for our writing. In our Reading sessions, we have been studying The Boy at the Back of the Class, which explores the experiences of a refugee who has come from Syria.

Groundbreakers



Year 5 had a great first week back. We have started to learn about Henry VIII and whether he was a tyrant or not. The children also had a magical experience of Forest School in the snow.

Trailblazers



We have returned from the festive break hitting the ground running. In English, pupils have begun a new text, 'Pig Heart Boy,' which follows 13-year-old Cameron as he faces a life-threatening heart condition and the difficult decision of needing a transplant to survive. In RE, pupils have been learning about Guru Hargobind & the importance of his two kirpans, exploring their historical significance.
