Nursery

In Nursery this week we had a lovely story and song time session with the Librarian from Manor Farm Library.

We have also been exploring different sounds; we've been listening to sounds around the house and animal noises and naming them.



Adventurers

This week we are continuing to learn our phonics, blending sounds to make a word. In English we have concluded our work on 'Ruby's Worry' by completing character descriptions and acting out our reactions. In maths we have been learning how to sort objects into a type, and creating sorting rules.

This week we have been reading our exciting new story book - Traction Man! We made predictions about the story based on the first illustration and we wrote about our favourite part. We have also been learning about toys from the Victorian times and comparing them with toys from now.



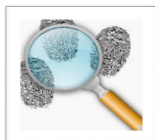
Explorers

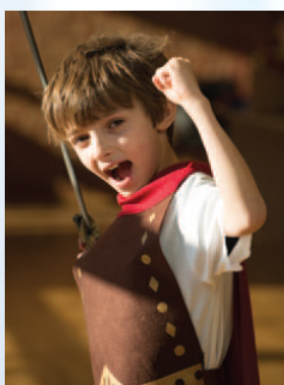
